Challenges: Overview from the June Summit

1. There are no agreed upon benchmarks or performed trends analyses on senior living resident engagement -> This makes resident engagement “nice to have” and “fun”, but not viewed often as necessary outside of regulatory requirements.
2. It’s not being measured as health impacting and a contributor to return on investment. Why?
3. And post pandemic, most operators, large and small, are struggling financially to make ends meet causing budget cuts, usually within activity and life enrichment departments, leaving little room for staffing and resources.



Opportunities: Overview from the June Summit

1. Redefine and create a new era of resident engagement
2. Create benchmarks derived from empirical research and clinical expertise
3. Move from “nice to have” and “fun” to “clinically necessary” and a “return on investment ROI”, shown in improvement of clinical and financial outcomes
4. Prove the need for resident engagement, leading to an increase in budget and staffing

Advancing Recreation and Cognitive Engagement Study

- ★ September 2017
- ★ Collaboration with Responsive Health Management, Inc., Western Oregon University, the Centre for Aging + Brain Health Innovation (CABHI), and Linked Senior
- ★ Findings :
Improving resident engagement can truly impact quality
 - 20% decrease in antipsychotic use
 - 18% decrease in aggressive behaviors
 - 20% increase in social engagement
 - 3% increase in cognitive performance

Resident Engagement Institute (REI) Research

- ★ Earlier this year, Linked Senior established the Resident Engagement Institute (REI) to continue this research endeavor.
- ★ To further examine how the use of APIE (Assess, Plan, Implement, and Evaluate), including social prescription during Planning, in resident engagement impacts **clinical outcomes**, like
 - fall reduction
 - lowers return to hospitalization rates
 - increases lengths of stay
 - decreases depression
 - lowers psychotropic use
 - and much more.

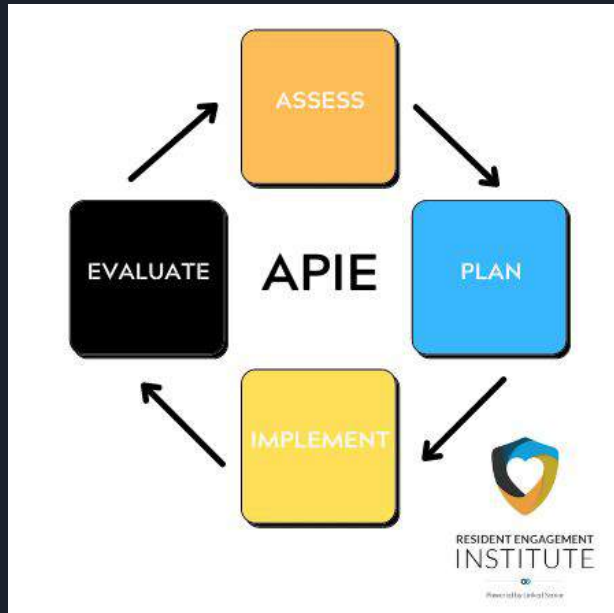




Resident Engagement Institute (REI) Research

- ★ Impacts financial outcomes or ROI, like
 - lowers return to hospitalization rates
 - increases lengths of stay
- then,
 - increases quality ratings
 - improves your 5-Star rating
 - enhance market competitiveness
 - boost referrals from hospitals and the community
 - increase the number of move-in's
 - enhance satisfaction ratings

APIE Process: Base for Successful Outcomes



- APIE is a standard of practice model in the recreation therapy field, amongst many other disciplines.
- Allows for a structured treatment process to take place

APIE Process: Base for Successful Outcomes

A = ASSESS

P = PLAN - Social prescription includes a person-centered approach to take the assessment information, including level of functioning and preference information, to assign an approach that include how much to engage and what to do that will improve these outcomes.

I = IMPLEMENT


E = EVALUATE

- ★ APIE process built within the Linked Senior platform allows for this standard of practice to occur, granting staff to be more efficient and effective in their role
- ★ Institutes social prescription within the planning component
- ★ Can analyze if the social prescription plan of the resident has contributed to improved clinical and financial outcomes
- ★ Will show that Activities is a ROI, as it's "clinically necessary"
